Before you start, it is important that you understand the differences between College and University programs...

College vs. University

Colleges tent to be more directly **career-oriented** than universities. This means they offer practical or hands-on training. Generally, a **certificate program** is 1 year or less, and a **diploma program** is 2 or 3 years. This can vary!

Colleges also have **pre-trades** and **apprenticeship** training, **language** training and **skills upgrading**.

Universities are institutions that can grant **degrees**. All universities have undergraduate (bachelor's) degrees, and many have graduate (Master's and doctoral) programs.

Undergraduate degrees usually take 3-4 years to complete, if you study full-time. An '**honours degree**' (the fourth year) is usually required if you want to go to a graduate program (Master's degree). Many universities allow students to combine subject areas (e.g., a Bachelor of Science in Chemistry and biology) into a 'double major'.

Many universities also offer **professional programs**, such as medicine, dentistry, and law. In some cases, you can begin these programs after 2 or 3 years of undergraduate study.

For this assignment, everyone will research **one university program** and **one college program**.
