WorkSafe Student Safety Video

Theme - Not all injuries are visible!

Regardless of where you work - at a retail store, an office, a restaurant, a construction site, or a hospital - you could be exposed to hazards in the air you breathe, in the materials you use or from contact with the people you meet.

This assignment challenges you to **create a video that explores the topic** of workplace injuries <u>we can't see</u>. Injuries such as broken bones, cuts, burns, and bruises may be easy to see, but mental injury, occupational diseases, and hearing loss can be harder to detect. Exposure to things like workplace stress, heat stress, asbestos, noise, pesticides, or other chemicals can lead to hidden injuries.

Video considerations

When making your video (<u>maximum two minutes</u>), think of a creative way to get your message across. All styles of video are fair game: drama, comedy, documentary, music video, stop-motion, claymation, animation - the choice is yours!
